



From The Librarian's Desk

Book renewals can be done easily – Just call the library and we'll take care of the rest! In 1910, the "Society of the Hall in the Grove," a local organization of graduates of the Chautauqua Literary and Scientific Circle met in Falconer. It was there that Susan Howe proposed the establishment of a library as a project of the society, and L. Theresa Benson proposed that each member contribute a book to form its nucleus. The members also gave one dollar each to start a book fund. Several members gave parties to raise money and contributions were solicited from the public. Books were kept on a shelf in Dr. William O. Smiths drug store, and later in Leonard Anderson's furniture store.
